Presentación con la autora Victoria Puig de Lange

La novela autobiográfica de la autora ecuatoriana Victoria Puig de Lange, ex-directora de *Harpers Bazaar* en español, es una historia de poder, amor y lucha, de fugitivos políticos y románticos dilemas, situada en un terreno de intriga e intereses humanos. El Tiempo de Bogotá la describe como 3... una aventura, un retrato íntimo y profundamente revelador del

temperamento de los latinoamericanos. Los protagonistas principales son los países donde le tocó vivir en un siglo donde todo pasó. Con sutil percepción, Victoria se asoma a la historia de culturas tan diferentes como la chilena y la del afrancesado New Orleans, la torturada historia colombiana y la turbulenta de su propio Ecuador, brindándonos su versión de eventos que el lector actual sólo conoce a través de densos textos de estudio, y que ella — milagro de juventud — vivió y describe en deliciosas anécdotas.

The autobiographic novel (in Spanish), authored by former Editor-in-Chief of *Harpers Bazaar* (Spanish International Edition), provides a revealing, humorous and at times controversial look at different Latin American cultures, seen through the eyes of someone who has lived and helped shape the history of journalism.
